Question: What is the status of the SIs that replace these directives? Where can the drafts be found? Have the SIs been laid before parliament or through the legislative progress?

Question: With regards to the eCD and limited liability, in a prolonged No Deal, there are a number of legislative changes going through parliament that will have an impact. To what extent have we considered the amount of potential implementation that businesses may have to do in order to align? For example with the copyright directive.

Answer: This is not a question that we are able to answer, but we can put you in touch with the right people. We are all operating under the same uncertainty so don't know yet whether it will

be agreed and fall in an implementation period or No Deal exit. Our overarching priority is to prioritise stability, so we will continue to align with current provisions.
